Tampa Chapter Of THAT Society To Present Concert

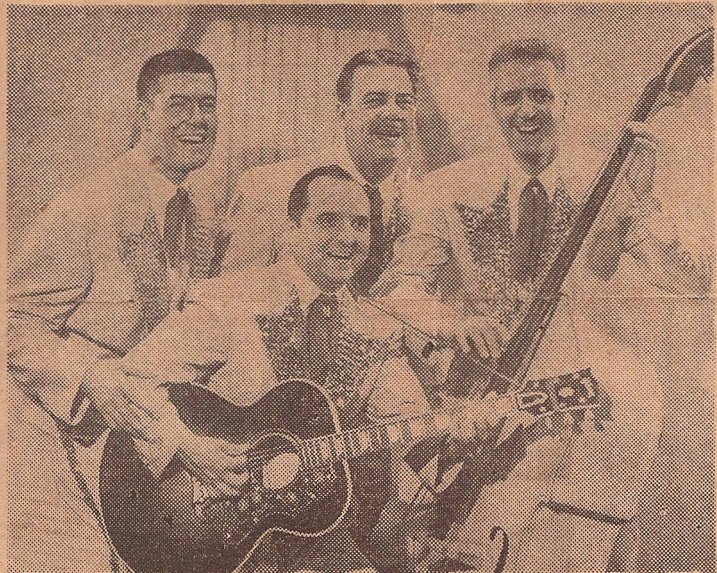
With several outstanding visiting barbershop-harmony experts, as well as distinguished local masters, the eighth annual Harvest of Harmony will be presented at 8 o'clock Wednesday night in the Municipal Auditorium, by the Tampa Chapter of the Society for the Preservation and Encouragement of Barber Shop Quartet Singing.

Featured attraction will be the internationally famous Mid-States Four, from Chicago, winner of the 1953 quartet contest of the national organization. As winners they were sent by the War Dept. on a tour of Korea to entertain members of the U. S. armed forces. They have sung in every major city of the U. S., besides radio and TV appearances.

A fresh new quartet from Florida State University is the Memory Four. Another feature here will be Tampa's Florida Knights, past winners of the Dixie district contest. The Miamians, 1954 winners, will also appear. The Tampa Pirate Chorus will open and close the show. Sam Breedon is director of the chorus.
